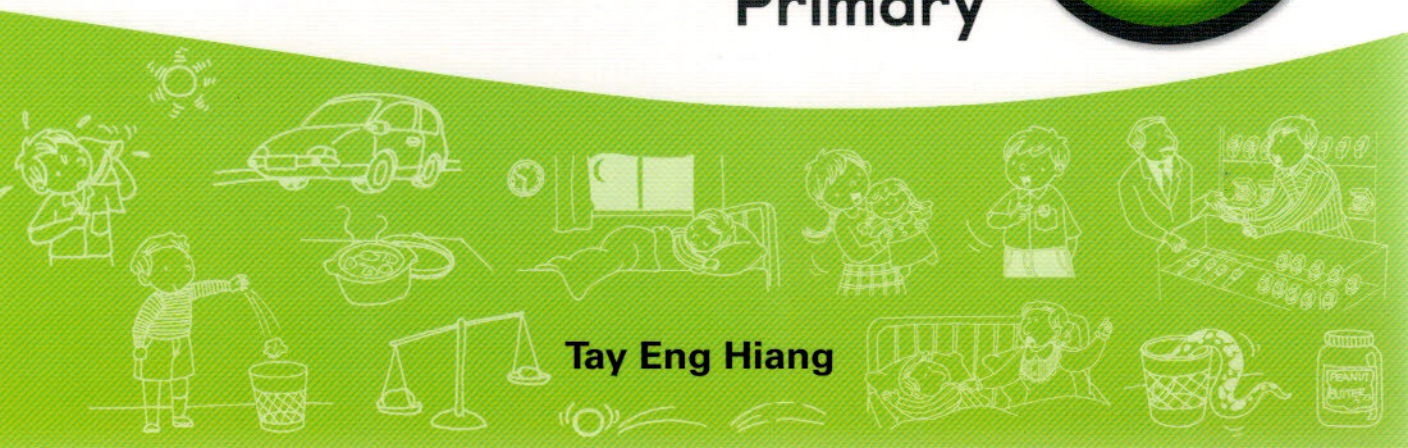

## PREFACE

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**GRAMMAR PRACTICE for Primary 3** (2nd Edition) is specially prepared to meet the English grammar practice needs of pupils. The exercises are based on the latest English Language Syllabus from the Ministry of Education and are designed to sharpen pupils' English grammar skills.

The section labelled 'Teaching Points' provides pupils with the foundational knowledge needed for the respective chapters. The exercises are divided into three graded levels to test and develop pupils' proficiency as they work through each chapter. Level 1 is a basic exercise that consists of mainly filling-in or underlining single words. Level 2 provides more independent practice and Level 3 offers practice of the grammar item with longer texts.

All of these exercises are strategically designed to enable the learner to pick up correct grammar usage even when working independently or under minimal supervision.

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# POSSESSIVE PRONOUNS (SINGULAR)

## Teaching Points

These are examples of singular **possessive pronouns**:

**mine, yours, his, hers**

**Possessive pronouns** show ownership.

A **singular possessive pronoun** shows who the **owner** is.

Study the examples below. The words in bold are **singular possessive pronouns**.

The dog is **mine**.



2. You have a cat.  
The cat is **yours**.



3. He has a bird.  
The bird is **his**.
